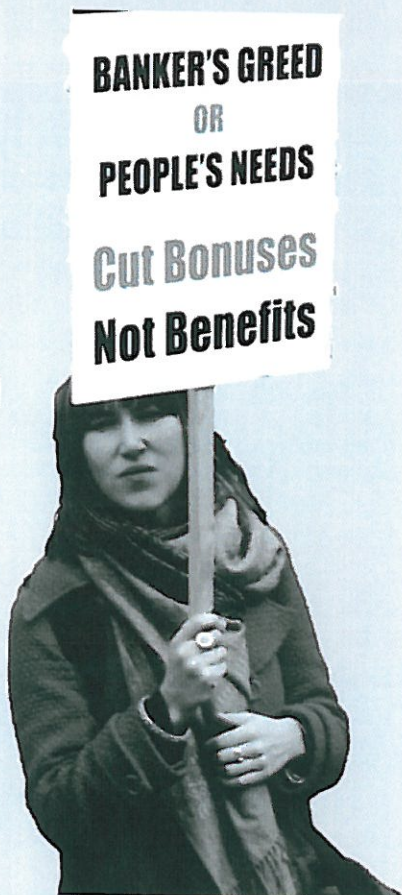

In Waltham Forest and  
across London, politicians  
think cuts are necessary.

Waltham Forest's Labour  
council has increased un-  
employment by administer-  
ing £65 million of Con-Dem  
cuts. Over 300 people have  
lost their jobs, including  
Trade Unionist and Socialist  
Coalition candidate Nancy  
Taaffe who was a library  
worker for eleven years. 20  
buildings have closed, in-  
cluding two more libraries.

The politics of cuts have  
increased poverty. The in-  
vasion of payday loan com-  
panies on the high street is  
symptomatic of this.

Young people face a much  
worse standard of living  
than their parents unless we  
kick out these self seeking,  
careerist politicians. This is  
what happened in Bradford,  
it can happen in London  
too.

The Trade Unionist and  
Socialist Coalition is stand-

ing in the London-wide list  
(orange ballot paper) part of  
the assembly elections.

**The Trade Unionist and  
Socialist Coalition says:**

- Reject all cuts. We call  
on councils to set budg-  
ets based on the needs  
of the people in the bor-  
ough, not on the needs of  
the bankers
- Councils should demand  
the needed money from  
central government and  
use their financial re-  
serves (eg the £40 million  
reserves held by Waltham  
Forest council) to prevent  
any immediate cuts
- End £120 billion of tax  
avoidance and evasion by  
the very rich – this money  
should be used to stop all  
cuts
- We stand for a broad  
based campaign across  
London of resistance to  
all cuts – make the bank-  
ers and big business pay  
for their crisis
